Established in 1984, the National Youth Choir of Wales has supported the long-standing choral traditions of Wales ever since, with many alumni still singing or conducting choirs throughout Wales and further afield. Our alumni can be heard performing professionally in concert halls and opera houses throughout the World, including Sir Bryn Terfel, Katherine Jenkins and current NYCW conductor, Tim Rhys-Evans.

The Choir's members, largely aged between 16 and 22 years, are drawn from all parts of Wales and auditioned annually. As with all NYAW ensembles, the choir works with first-class professional musicians to deliver its key strategic aim of excellence.

Tim Rhys-Evans

Tim Rhys-Evans has worked with the NYCW for five years and is himself an alumnus of the Choir.

He worked as a professional opera singer for some years before realising that his real passion lay in the creation and facilitation of music, specialising in choral music, opera, and musical theatre. He is passionate about creating grassroots musical opportunities for all; ensuring that everyone with the talent, discipline and commitment has access to pathways into advanced study of music and performance.

Tim believes passionately in the transformative power of music and that everybody should be given the opportunity to engage in the arts. To this end, in 2010 he established The



Aloud Charity which runs the choirs Only Boys Aloud and Only Kids Aloud. With the shared aims of reinvigorating the Welsh male choir tradition and affecting real change in the lives of young people from areas of social deprivation, these initiatives have improved the lives of thousands of children from some of the poorest communities in Wales.

After working extensively in opera and music theatre, he created the group Only Men Aloud, a Welsh male vocal ensemble whose highlights have included winning BBC's Last Choir Standing, winning Album of the Year at the Classical Brit awards, singing at the opening ceremony of the London 2012 Olympic Games and recording and performing internationally.

Tim's skill as a composer and arranger mean that his works are regularly performed across the globe. He was formerly signed to Sony ATV and has signed a publishing deal with Warner Chappell.

He has been honoured by several organisations including ordination to the Gorsedd of Bards at the Royal National Eisteddfod in 2010, appointed an MBE by HM The Queen in 2013, an Honorary Doctor of Music from the University of South Wales in 2017 and an Honorary Fellowship of the Royal Welsh College of Music & Drama in 2019.

Nicola Rose

Born in London into a musical family, Nicola began her musical training as one of the founding girl choristers at Salisbury Cathedral. She is a graduate of the Royal Welsh College of Music and Drama where she was the recipient of numerous awards and she continued working there as a Junior Fellow before completing her studies at the National Opera Studio in London.

As a repetiteur, Nicola has worked with NYCW, Welsh National Opera, Music Theatre Wales and Barefoot Opera as well as with the education and community departments of The Royal Opera House, Garsington Opera, English National Opera and Opera Holland Park.



Nicola recently received notable critical acclaim for her work as music director of Welsh National Opera's *Rhondda Rips it up!* – a newly commissioned work by Elena Langer about the suffragette movement in Wales.

Nicola has a wealth of experience in extending performances outside the mainstream theatres and concert halls, as an alumna of Yehudi Menuhin's *Live Music Now* scheme, a current member of Lost Chord and a pianist and conductor of the Forget-me-not Chorus. She has worked as a vocal coach and repetiteur on the Italian Opera Summer School in Southern Italy, at Zurich Opera Studio and at the Indemini Music Festival in Switzerland. She is currently a pianist and vocal coach at the Royal Welsh College of Music and Drama and enjoys working throughout the UK with instrumentalists and singers alike.

Your support could help National Youth Arts Wales give a musician the opportunity to represent Wales, and to benefit from world-class tuition and performance opportunities.

Your support, alongside the support of Arts Council of Wales and Welsh Government, allows us to subsidise places to everyone on our residencies to keep costs as low as possible for all members.

But for those who need further support, we also award more than £50,000 a year of support through our generous Bursary Scheme, so no young person need worry about the cost of attending our residencies. This support can range from 25% – 100% of residency fees depending on circumstances. This year, **over 40% of NYCW members** have received a full or partial bursary towards their residency costs. Between them, they received discounted fees worth nearly £17,000.

The Bursary Fund covers automatic fee waivers to those most in need, as well as travel costs and other expenses. Without the generosity of our supporters, we simply wouldn't be able to offer this level of support.

In 2021, National Youth Arts Wales was awarded an Arts Scholarship grant of £165,448 from the Leverhulme Trust, which will support hundreds of young people from lower-income backgrounds to take part in our advanced performance training. The funding has allowed NYAW to substantially expand its current programme of bursaries and development programmes over the next four years, benefitting 240 young people each year by 2024-25 across all our ensembles.
